Pertussis (Whooping Cough) in Manitoba

This year, 51 lab-confirmed cases of pertussis have been reported in the province, with over half of these cases in infants and children less than 5 years of age. This is higher than what has been reported in previous years. Cases have been largely concentrated in Southern Health-Santé Sud, with the majority unimmunized.

Manitoba Health, Healthy Living and Seniors (MHLS) updated its eligibility criteria for publicly-funded (i.e. free-of-charge) tetanus, diphtheria, acellular pertussis (Tdap) vaccine as follows:

- Individuals at 14 to 16 years of age (Grade 8 or 9 school-based program).
- Individuals who missed the vaccine in Grade 8 or 9 and are born on or after January 1, 1989.
- Adults who are due for a Td booster and have not previously received a pertussis-containing vaccine in adulthood*.
- Primary caregivers of a newborn infant up to 6 months of age who have not previously received a pertussis-containing vaccine in adulthood*.
- Pregnant women \geq 26 weeks of pregnancy who have not received a dose of a pertussis-containing vaccine in adulthood.

**There is no minimum interval between the Td and Tdap vaccine.*

Please continue to offer the primary series vaccine (DTaP-IPV-Hib) to infants at 2, 4, 6 and 18 months of age, as well as the booster vaccine (Tdap-IPV) at 4 to 6 years of age to all your patients. For those individuals previously unimmunized against pertussis, please refer to Manitoba's *Recommended Immunization Schedule for Individuals NOT Previously Immunized* at: www.gov.mb.ca/health/publichealth/cdc/div/not.html.

If you suspect pertussis, please submit an NP swab (cotton and calcium alginate are not suitable) in Amie's Transport Medium as soon as possible (within 48 hours) to the laboratory.
