

IT'S SAFE TO ASK...

- ◆ Ask questions if you do not understand something. Make a list of your questions.
- ◆ It's okay to ask staff if they have cleaned their hands.
- ◆ Ask a family member, caregiver or friend to be with you at your appointment.
- ◆ Ask why a test or procedure is needed and how it can help you.
- ◆ Interpreters can be arranged for many languages through the WRHA language access program.



IT'S SAFE TO TELL...

- ◆ Tell your dental professional your important health information. Do not assume they already know.

HOME SAFETY...

- ◆ Your toothbrush contains germs. Do not share your toothbrush with anyone.
- ◆ Change your toothbrush every 3 months or when frayed/worn.
- ◆ Do not keep your toothbrush near the toilet as water may spray when flushing and contaminate your toothbrush.

WE CARE ABOUT YOUR SAFETY

- ✦ We want everyone to feel safe and be safe at all times.
- ✦ One of the best ways to meet this goal is to work with you. Please ask questions and make suggestions.



PATIENT IDENTIFICATION

- ✦ Patient identification is important to prevent errors and ensure that intended procedures are provided to the correct patient.
- ✦ Staff will ask you often for your name and date of birth.
- ✦ Please check the name, date of birth and all personal information on your paperwork.
- ✦ Tell your dental professional if your contact information changes.

PREVENTING INFECTION

- ✦ Hand cleanser is found at entrances, waiting areas & elevators. Clean your hands often.



- ✦ Use a tissue when you cough or sneeze, then wash your hands. If you do not have a tissue, use your upper sleeve.
- ✦ If you develop a cold, cough, flu, rash or fever, please call your dental office before your appointment.
- ✦ Follow the post-operative instructions provided after extraction, oral surgery or complex dental care.
- ✦ Let staff know if you are at risk for bacterial endocarditis.

PREVENTION OF FALLS

- ✦ Tell your dental professional if you feel dizzy or drowsy.
- ✦ Let staff know if there are obstacles that could cause you to fall.
- ✦ Wet floors may cause you to slip and fall.

MEDICATION SAFETY

- ✦ Make a list of all prescribed drugs, traditional medicine, over-the-counter products, vitamins and herbs. Use the Manitoba Institute for Patient Safety card to make your list or ask your pharmacist for this resource.
